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Dear Faithful,

As so often happens, after finally completing all the major ceremonies after the death of Bp. Dolan, (Funeral, ordinations, and episcopal consecration), I soon found myself back on the road, headed to the northern missions, as well as to Milwaukee for the Feast of the Ascension and the weekend, which includes our May Crowning on Sunday. Finally, all the snow seems to be gone and the green has begun to come to life. On one hand, hitting the road so soon after so much activity has found me realizing how tired I really am. In very positive news, one of the couples in my Grand Forks mission texted me the other day with the happy report of welcoming their first child. Mom and baby are doing well, and I will look forwarded to baptizing her the next time I head up to the mission. Babies are always a happy announcement, but a first baby of a young marriage carries an extra bit of joy with it. It is such a momentous change to a couple's lives... but a change which carries innumerable blessings with it.

Dealing with change can often provide trials. However, when change accompanies the following of God's Divine plan, the trials also harbor in many gifts from above. The Apostles had to accept the change of the departure of Our Lord at the Ascension and the trial of their new mission to preach the gospel, but the Holy Ghost came to them nine days later to give them great gifts. Parents lose their independence and much sleep with the arrival of baby, but the love which is magnified by his/her arrival outshines these trials and the raising of a faithful Christian child is part of parent's sanctification as well. For us at St. Gertrude's, the loss of Bp. Dolan has been a difficult change to embrace, and the new roles in life we embrace moving forward have their trials, but this change has come with the great blessings of new priests and a new bishop... and I know many more great things will come too, as we continue to follow God's Divine plan in this too.
